

History of the Office

Constitution Amended in 1932 and 1954 Combined two offices



Assuming Office

Bonds Payable to the County and State

- Post before taking office
- Not to exceed \$100,000 unless population of 1.5 million or more
- Failure to Produce New Bonds
- Premiums to be paid by County
- Official Oath
- Deposits and Reports (bank accounts)

Duties and Responsibilities

- Liability of the County Tax Assessor-Collector
- Primary Responsibility of the County Tax Assessor-Collector
- Collection of Delinquent Taxes



Description of Office



- Calculate property tax rates for the county and 80 other taxing entities
- Collect property taxes for 80 taxing entities
- Correct tax roll and other records to reflect final determination of value



- 80% of County Revenue
- Funds Collected Provide
 - Law Enforcement
 - Judicial System
 - Road & Bridge Maintenance
 - Public Health



FACTS ABOUT COUNTY TAXES:

The total county tax rate is comprised of \$0.0623/\$100 for Debt Service and \$0.3460/\$100 for Maintenance and Operation which funds among others:

- 762 Law Enforcement Officers
- 214 Detention Officers
- 7 Libraries
- 8 District Courts, 5 County Courts, and 5 Justice of the Peace Courts
- Road and Bridge budgets for 4 Commissioners
- County and District Clerk's offices
- County and District Attorney's offices

Duties and Responsibilities

The Tax Assessor-Collector is an agent for:

- Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (TxDMV)
- Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC)
- Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (CPA)
- Texas Parks & Wildlife Department (TPWD)

Additionally, on behalf of the County and other taxing entities, the Montgomery County Tax Assessor-Collector processes all Tax Abatement Agreements and semi-annual reports to insure that each party to the Agreement is in compliance with their Agreement and County policy.

Description of Office

- Process all motor vehicle & trailer registrations for residents of the county
- Process & collect sales tax for all motor vehicle title transfers for residents of the county
- Process & collect sales tax for boat & motor titles and registrations
- Collects various other fees for the state and county (TABC & Occupational Taxes)







Description of Office

Last fiscal year, the tax office brought in over 2.1 billion dollars!




Vehicle Titles & Registration




Vehicle Titles & Registration


Registered Vehicles
